Home Practice Guide #5—Violins (Due the week of June 1, 2015)

Dear parents,

As we move into our last couple of months of music classes, we want to update you on where your child's skill level should be in the strings class. By this time, students should be able to comfortably and confidently read the notes D, E, F#, and G. It is important that your child be comfortable with these 4 notes, as we will continue to add the remaining 4 notes (A, B, C#, and high D) between now and the end of April. By the beginning of May, we will be reading all 8 notes on the music staff. Placement of notes on the staff depends on which instrument your child plays (violin, viola, or cello).

If your child is struggling with the first four notes and has been practicing diligently at home, then you should let us know by email so we can provide special help and check for technical problems. We have been working in class to identify students who are struggling so we can help them and so we can let you know. Remember that practicing at home is the first order of getting better. Ten to twenty minutes of nightly practice is expected to achieve these results. By the Spring Concert, most students will need 20-30 minutes of regular practice. Some students do it with less time and some students may need coaching on how to practice smarter.

All 4th grade string students will participate in a final, end-of-the-year concert at Wood Canyon Elementary School in the Performing Arts Center (PAC). More details will be coming home on this important concert very soon! If the date assigned to your child's school is inconvenient, you may attend the alternate date. (Please send a note if you plan on the alternate date so we can keep a count of students.) If your child does not attend for any reason, a short make-up report may be done to maintain their grade. An instruction page is available upon request.
