Honor Orchestra

Your child has an opportunity to audition for the Capistrano Unified School District 4th Grade Honor Orchestra. Audition material is on pages 24-26 in our textbook and ALL SONGS will need to be **memorized** no later than the last week of February and auditions will take place during normal class time. In addition to song mastery, students will be selected based on tone quality, posture, and proper position. Two to four students are selected per school for this prestigious group. If your child is selected, there is one short, evening rehearsal the week before the concert. The concert will be on a Saturday in March 2014.

Benchmark Songs

During the 2nd Learning Cycle, your child will be learning 7 basic songs that we will call "4th Grade Benchmark Songs." When listening and watching your child, listen for a good sound (tone quality) and look for proper playing position and good posture. Your child should be able to play each of the songs along the following timeline:

January: Mary Had a Little Lamb & Mary Doubles

February: Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star, Twinkle Variation, French Folk Song, &

Tuneful Tune March: Ode to Joy

All 7 songs need to be memorized for a parent demonstration assembly in mid/late March.

Music Grades

All students in grades 4 and 5 receive music grades during the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} Learning Cycles. In previous years, music grades were given in the form of O (Outstanding), S (Satisfactory), AC (Area of Concern), and U (Unsatisfactory). As of the 2013-2014 school year, all music grades will be the same as the rest of the academic subjects: 4, 3, 2, 1. All students should be working toward the grade level standard(s) in music (Benchmark songs). By the end of February, your child should be able to play Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star and French Folk Song with his/her book.
