Benchmark Songs

During the 2nd Learning Cycle, your child will be learning 7 basic songs that we will call “4th Grade Benchmark Songs.” When listening and watching your child, listen for a good sound (tone quality) and look for proper playing position and good posture. Your child should be able to play each of the songs along the following timeline:

Music Grades

All students in grades 4 and 5 receive music grades during the 2nd and 3rd Learning Cycles. All music grades will be the same as the rest of the academic subjects: 4, 3, 2, 1. All students should be working toward the grade level standard(s) in music (Benchmark songs). By the end of February, your child should be able to play Mary Had a Little Lamb (p. 15 line 32) and Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star (p. 25 line 59), and French Folk Song (p. 26 line 61) with his/her book.

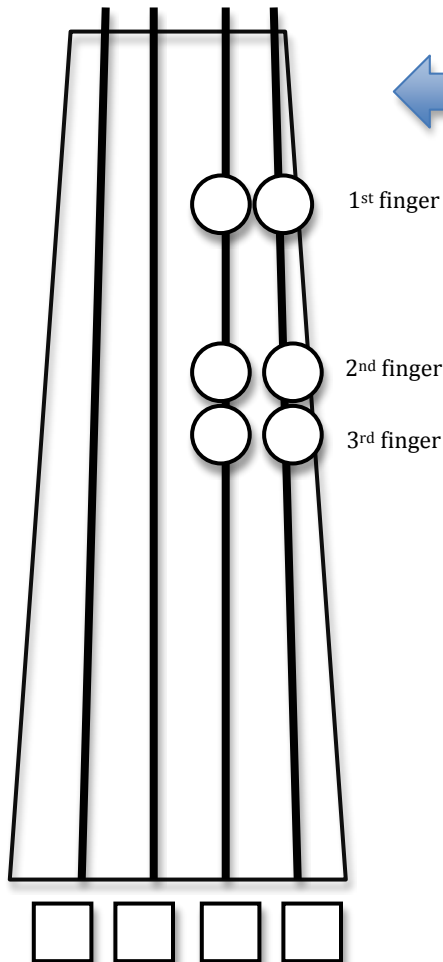
